Wondering what archaeology was found at the new housing sites on Dunmore Road? Excavation by Oxford Archaeology uncovered the remains of roundhouses and enclosures from the Iron Age, around 2500 years ago, and a trackway dating to the Roman period, around 2000 years ago, that linked Abingdon into the local Roman road network.
